




Highway Trust Fund Income (\$ billion)

National Highway System (NHS)

The National Highway System consists of roadways important to the nation's economy, defense, and mobility.

National Highway System Highway

The National Highway System consists of roadways important to the nation's economy, defense, and mobility.

1. Interstate
2. Other Principal Arterials: highways providing access between an arterial and a major port, airport, public transportation facility, or other intermodal transportation facility
3. Strategic Highway Network(STRAHNET): an network of highways which are important to the United States' strategic defense policy
4. Intermodal Connectors: These highways provide access between major intermodal facilities and the other four subsystems making up the National Highway [System](#).
