



Parcel delivery – Transformation

- Post Office Established in 1775 to provide Universal Mail Service
- Prior to 1913, the Post Office Department could not carry parcels greater than 4 lbs.
- Parcel Post was established on 01/01/1913 and was an instant success spurring growth of great Mail-Order houses, the first of which was Montgomery Ward, followed by Sears, Roebuck and Company. Weight was limited to 11 lbs. until 1952.
- Until 2006, Mail Volumes continued to grow and was the primary focus of the Postal Service

USPS Interest In Final 50' Package Delivery

- USPS has experienced a significant reduction in First Class Mail Volume
- Corresponding growth in Package Volumes
