



Big Picture: Working Better Together


- Intermodal transportation combining the flexibility of road with the dependability of rail – provides cargo owners with a more stable and flexible network.

Transportation accounts for more than half of global supply chain operating costs.









Supply Chain: Transportation Modes




Intermodal Year-to-Date: June 8, 2013





The Crescent Corridor in NC

Annually in North Carolina:

- 392,000 fewer long-haul trucks on highways
- \$21 million less in congestion costs for motorists
- \$81 million in logistics savings for businesses
- \$4.2 million less in highway maintenance costs
- 69,000 fewer tons of CO2 released


