

Larger and Heavier










Overlap between DOT and Industry

 Public Sector – minimize disruptions and impacts while promoting commerce.








Overlap between DOT and Industry

• Shippers and Carriers – efficiency of process, routing, and ultimately minimizing time, cost and promoting safety and reliability.




Mutually Beneficial Topics

constraints








OSOW Recommendations
