FHWA MATC ASPHALT 101 COURSE

The FHWA Mobile Asphalt Technology Center (MATC) is offering a free 1-day training course to members of State highway agencies, contractors, local agencies, tribal governments, and other organizations who engage in the design and construction of asphalt pavements. The goal of this introductory-level course is to provide background on asphalt mixtures: how they are designed, how they are produced, how they are constructed, and how they are evaluated. The course is intended to introduce key concepts on the cradle-to-construct portion of the life of an asphalt pavement. After successful completion of the training, participants will be equipped to apply practices that can aid in effective inspection and better identify issues with asphalt materials and construction to improve quality.

WHAT WILL YOU DISCUSS?

The training course introduces basic concepts and practices to improve quality throughout the entire asphalt paving process. Effective practices for material handling, testing, inspection, and the paving process are presented in the context of the host state. Topics of discussion include:

- Materials and Mix Design
- Production and Mix Transport
- Surface Preparation and Placement
- Compaction and Post-Construction Evaluation
