This is in reference to Mr. Lorenzo Casanova's September 29 email message that forwarded a Special Experimental Projects No. 14 (SEP-14), workplan from the Fairfax County Department of Transportation and the Department of Public Works and Environmental Services. The County plans to evaluate the Basic Order Agreement (BOA) contracting delivery method for various transit, pedestrian and bicycle projects throughout the County.

We agree with Mr. Casanova's assessment that the County's use of the BOA contracting method is similar to the job order or indefinite delivery/indefinite quantity contracting methods used by other agencies under SEP- 14.

The workplan did not include a commitment to evaluate and report on the effectiveness of this method. Please inform the County, that a brief annual evaluation of all Federal-aid projects utilizing this contracting method will be required. The evaluation should include a comparison of the cost, schedule and quality obtained under the BOA contracting method in comparison with the traditional process.
